Orientation


- Get to know the paraprofessional supporting the students.
- Consider the paraprofessional's skills, abilities and interests.
- Introduce the paraprofessional to policies, routines, people, roles, and student/ classroom/ school responsibilities
- Establish and review student and staff schedules.

Familiarize the Paraprofessional with Your Classroom (page 10)

• Provide an initial orientation to your classroom.

Planning and Scheduling (page 11 & 12)

• Scheduling should determine specific responsibilities for the paraprofessional.



 Delegation is a process that consists of steps that can be learned by teachers even if they entered the profession believing that supervision of paraprofessionals was not part of their job.
